Letter from the Pastor

Faithfull members Ulysses First United Methodist,

Lent is observed as a time of spiritual discipline, repentance, and renewal. It is a time for God's church to examine their hearts before celebrating Jesus Christ's resurrection.

I know that sometimes it is hard to hold onto faith and trust in God, especially when things have gone wrong in our lives, relationships have fallen apart, and we can see and feel nothing apart from the hurting of our hearts. But, how do you respond to circumstances that test your faith?

As I struggle to give an answer to the question, the first word that comes to my mind is "Fellowship." Fellowship is an integral part of church life. We all need it, whether we like to admit it or not, especially as Christians!

Acts 2:42 reads, "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."

There is something powerful about having fellowship and togetherness with one another that helps us get through the bumps and bruises of life. We gain strength when we realize we don't have to walk through things alone.

I know some might argue that they have tried church, and found it to be failing, and even though they didn't expect "perfection", they at least, were hoping for something close! If all we are doing as the body of Christ is looking to avoid conflict, then we're probably not really enjoying the Christian life: the mark of community, the true biblical unity, is not the absence of conflict but THE PRESENCE OF A RECONCILING AND UNIFYING SPIRIT. This kind of spirit is not some sort of mask we wear, but a strong aspiration we find in Christ no matter the situation.

We live in a challenging moment, yet there is nothing quite so powerful as the strength we receive from the Lord as we fellowship together. Fellowship implies putting into action the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

Thus, I urge you, faithful members of Ulysses First United Methodist Church, to not let trials turn you away from faith in God. Don't let the tests make your heart wane. Call upon the Lord for help and trust in His strength. Remember the prize that awaits you in Christ Jesus.
